The Royal Hospital Donnybrook is a highly respected, voluntary charity that has been continuously operating for 279 years. It now provides HSE-funded hospital in-patient and day hospital care for adults and older people who need rehabilitation that can safely be provided outside an acute hospital, along with HIQA-registered residential care for 50 people. Service streams include orthopaedic, general frail elderly and stroke rehabilitation services. Set in 13.5 acres of lovely grounds in the heart of Dublin 4, the service is



managed by an entirely voluntary Board of Management. There are no private beds, no private consultants and all patients are treated equally irrespective of means; the Hospital is effectively already operating to the 'Slaintecare' model being introduced by Government. The Board has ambitious plans to develop the grounds into an Integrated Care Campus, incorporating the rehabilitation services with primary care services, a new purpose-built residential unit and housing with supports, all closed linked to the community and integrated with our key referral service, St. Vincent's University Hospital.

Thanks to the ongoing support by the Friends of the Royal Hospital Donnybrook, the quality of life of our residents and patients is enhanced. We are a publicly funded hospital and as a result are very restricted in our budget when it comes to the provision of equipment and enhancing the general surroundings.

The Friends have funded many pieces of clinically very effective rehabilitation equipment; The Andago, a Pressurised Mapping System, Powered Wheelchairs, redecorating the coffee shop and two family rooms. The two Hospital Transport Buses which the Friends have donated to the hospital allows us to safely and in a



timely fashion transport our patients to St. Vincent's and other clinical hospital facilities for outpatient and diagnostic appointments. Without this transport, our patients and residents would be waiting for wheelchair taxi or reliant on often ageing carers and relatives. The positive impact of this cannot be measured from a patient experience perspective.

The environment in a rehabilitation setting is important to promote enablement and independence. As part of their therapy, patients are encouraged to walk our long corridors with distances marked. Along these corridors, beautiful Artwork is on display which is a welcome distraction as well as inspiration to our patients.

We continue to be grateful to the Friends for their contribution to the quality of life of our patients and residents who are often very frail and vulnerable during their time with us in the Royal Hospital Donnybrook.

Physiotherapy Department Elaine Ross, Head of Physiotherapy Department

The physiotherapy department provides care to all the rehabilitation wards, residential and the Day Hospital units.

To advocate, enable and empower our patients to achieve their optimal well-being. To provide excellence in clinical care through education, training and innovation. To deliver a holistic patient centred approach through collaborative teamwork within our integrated care campus.

As a result, the current gym space is now centred on our patient's needs with state-of-the-art equipment in an enriched environment enabling Physiotherapists, to deliver high quality, holistic patient centred care.

Occupational Therapy Department Jo Cannon Head of OT

Occupational Therapy (OT) is the use of assessment and treatment to develop, recover or maintain the daily living and work skills of people with physical, mental or cognitive disorders. Occupational Therapists focus on identifying and eliminating environmental barriers to independence and participation in daily activities



by adapting the environment, modifying the task and teaching new skills.

Our patients continue to benefit from The Friends funded Bioness Integrated Therapy System (BITS). This is interactive modern therapeutic tool used in the treatment of neurological conditions. As a result, we are continuing to use the interactive digital touch screen rather than pen and paper when designing treatment programmes for our patient's undergoing rehabilitation.



This technology allows a visual screen to give patient's immediate results and feedback. The clinical treatment areas available to therapists include:

- Visual Rehabilitation increase visual search and scanning abilities
- Cognitive Rehabilitation attention, memory and problem-solving skills
- Eye-hand Coordination
- Improve peripheral vision
- Boost confidence for completing daily living tasks.

In addition, The Friends funded a new Pressure Mapping System for the detection and prevention of pressure areas in patients when sitting in specialised seating systems. There is a high level of disability within our resident / patient population and preventing pressure areas developing is a high priority for patient comfort and well-being.

The OT Department relies on transport to carry out some essential Community Integration work with patients getting them ready to engage back in daily life in the own community. This work would not feasible without the new vehicles funded by The Friends. We are very grateful to be able to avail of this for the benefit of our patients.

High-quality, Person-centred care is the primary focus of care in RHD. The Department of Nursing, Quality and Risk plays a key role in this.

The department encompasses nursing, activities, volunteers, catering, and risk with a complement of over 200 staff. Each of these areas work together to enhance patient and

resident care, to provide a positive experience and improve outcomes for patients and residents. Each member of the department plays an important role in quality improvement which enables us to improve and maintain RHD as a modern healthcare facility.

Key to improvements and ongoing development is our fundraising, the funds raised to support RHD have greatly enhanced the offering for patients and residents. Initiatives such as the resident bursary which provides funding for social outings and events each year greatly adds to the lived experience for residents here. This funding is key as no other funding stream is available for resident activities. Fundraising also allows us to improve and update communal spaces and provide transport.

It is also hoped in the coming months to upgrade the concert hall to a modern multi-functional space, allowing for more uses by patients and residents. The Department is looking forward to the future collaborations with the Friends of the Royal in further developing and improving our services for all our patients and residents.

Speech & Language Therapy (SLT) provides support to adults who have difficulties with communication or with eating, drinking and swallowing. Alongside our multi-disciplinary colleagues, we are all about making a positive difference in people's everyday lives. SLTs support people to access to their work, recreational and social lives. We also enable people to make choices about their health care. To do this, we use both evidence-based and innovative therapy techniques and resources, with the support of both high and low tech equipment.

The Medical Social Work (MSW) department provides psychosocial and practical support to patients and residents, and their relatives/ friends, during their stay. This can include emotional support with life changes or events, thinking about or planning for the future, assistance accessing services, advice on entitlements, support with decision making, addressing concerns about the person's welfare or safety. Central to our philosophy is to uphold the rights of each individual and to maximise his/ her potential for independence and self- determination.

Members of the team also take lead or active roles in the Resident's Forum, Safeguarding, End of Life Care, LGBTQ multidisciplinary group, HSCP and Staff Wellness Groups, and other MDT initiatives.

The introduction of Music Therapy funded by the Friends has had an incredibly positive impact on the lives of both patients and residents. Rehabilitation gains are already evident and the Music Therapist has become a vital part of the MDT.
